

# TOOL LIST

First day requirements are **emboldened**.

- ☞ **One 1½" and one 1¾" plane iron.** (Hock, standard replacement, or used)
- ☞ One 1⅝" block plane replacement iron (new or used) or Hock radiused iron for a round bottomed plane  
Hock irons are available here, as are inexpensive saws for dovetailing.
- ☞ Low angle **block plane**, preferably 1⅜". It's worth spending money on these; avoid the new Stanley #60-½ and Record of any vintage. Stanley Sweethearts are adequate.

| <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>☞ Dovetail saw (Western or Japanese)</li><li>☞ Set of chisels ⅛" to 1" or wider ½"</li><li>☞ Marking gauge (Veritas or equal; better suited to modest work than blocky types)</li><li>☞ <b>6" engineers square</b> (or better, as below)</li><li>☞ <b>Straight blade screwdrivers:</b> ¼" x 6", ⅝" stubby (for tightening cap iron screws Craftsman #00941586000 optional)</li></ul> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>☞ Hand scraper</li><li>☞ Burnishing tool</li><li>☞ <b>Rule or tape measure</b></li><li>☞ Small bevel gauge</li><li>☞ <b>4–6 oz. hammer (plane iron adjustment)</b></li><li>☞ Small mallet (approximately 10 oz. for chopping dovetails)</li><li>☞ Glue bottle</li><li>☞ Bench brush</li></ul> |

- ☞ **Sharpening stones**, either:
  - Oil stones: India, soft Arkansas or Washita, and hard Arkansas; or
  - Water stones: 1200, 4000, and 6000 grits (King "S") or equivalent.
  - Norton ceramic stones will be available for purchase here.
- ☞ Files: 4" mill smooth, 6-8" mill bastard and an inexpensive set of needle files
- ☞ **Safety glasses or goggles**
- ☞ **Hearing protectors (w/o stereo)**
